Objectives of the Program:

Strategies Undertaken

2. To help students get comfortable with the campus environment, facilities, and infrastructure session taken on student Support Cell by Ms. Kiran Sardana, session on Library by Dr. Aparna Bawa, Campus Tour were undertaken by Program Coordinator Dr. Sanjay Manocha.
3. To promote bonding among students through ice-breaking session was organized with fun activities, group tasks, and interactive games by Ms. Rupam Jyoti Deka.
4. To make the student campus ready, session on Discipline, Rules & Regulations, Dress Code were addressed by Dr. Indu Rani-Faculty In-charge of Discipline Committee.

5. Students were eager to know about the placement at BVIMR and to explain various campus recruitment by top MNCs and big corporates, Dr. Neelam Sharma, Placement in-charge at Corporate Resource Centre, BVIMR took a very interactive session answering all queries by students.
6. To encourage the students for co-curricular activities session was conducted where Cultural Committee in charge Dr. Ashima Bhatnagar and Ms. Anuradha Nain introduced importance of co-curricular participation for overall personality development. Then all the Faculty Coordinators along with the student members gave presentation on various clubs like Suave (Dance society), Swaang (Dramatics Club), Adwik (Music Society), Kalakriti (Arts & Crafts society), Qasid (Literary Club), Netlink (Social Media Club) etc. Session on various Academic clubs were also taken by Dr. Aditi Malhotra (Faculty In charge, Marketing Club) and Dr. Ashima Bhatnagar (Faculty In charge, HR Club).
7. Session on practical implication of Business Management studies on real life, session on Business Case Study Methodologies for Management Decision-Making” taken by various academic expert like Prof. Dr. Anoop Pandey (Professor, HNB Garhwal University, Himachal Pradesh) and Dr. Geeta Mishra (Associate Professor, Department of Continuing Education and Extension, University of Delhi) who engaged the students with Case Study and Simulation exercises to make the students understand real-life business challenges, enabling students to apply conceptual frameworks to complex problems.
8. To give practical implication of Business studies and real corporate life expose Industry Veteran, Dr. Vinesh Malik took a session on “Harnessing AI & Technology for Business Growth: Essential Skills for Future Leaders”. To give more clarity about students’ expectations and outcome, Interaction with Alumni was conducted where students interacted openly with alumni of BVIMR, New Delhi.
9. The program featured esteemed industry veterans who delivered insightful sessions. Notably, Mr. Arun Rawal shared expertise on "Time Management and Productivity," providing practical strategies for effective time utilization. Additionally, Mr. Vivek Bindra conducted a session on "From Data to Drama: Storytelling in Business Decision Making," highlighting the art of

transforming data into compelling narratives to drive business decisions. These sessions offered valuable industry perspectives and actionable takeaways.

10. The session was also taken by Dr. Seema Chaudhary, Faculty In-charge of the Social Club, who highlighted initiatives enhancing students' personality development. This was followed by Dr. Sourabh Bansal, Faculty In-charge of the Finance Club, who discussed club activities. These sessions provided students with opportunities to explore their interests, develop essential skills, and gain practical experience.
11. The BVIMR Alumni Body interacted with MBA students, sharing valuable insights on "Navigating the MBA Journey." This session provided students with real-world perspectives, career guidance, and industry expectations. Additionally, Mr. Ashish Saraf, a spiritual speaker from ISKCON, delivered a session on "Science of Self-Universal Human Values and Managing Your Mind," exploring the intersection of spirituality and management. He discussed how cultivating self-awareness and human values can enhance personal and professional growth.

Outcome of the Program

1. Students gained clarity on course structure, specializations, credit system, grading, evaluation methods, and academic expectations.
2. Students came out of their inhibition on their very first day through Ice-breaker sessions and group activities promoting collaboration and peer bonding.

DAY 1: 7th July, 2025 – WELCOME & INTRODUCTION:

Theme: The Journey Begins

The orientation programme began with enthusiasm as students from the MBA 1st Semester (Batch 2025–27) arrived for their first formal interaction with the institute. This session took the students into the world of Artificial Intelligence, data-driven decision-making, and automation. Mr. Malik began with real-world examples of how AI is revolutionizing industries such as retail, finance, healthcare, and logistics. He spoke about automation in hiring, customer personalization through AI tools, predictive analytics in sales forecasting, and the ethical use of emerging technologies.

He stressed that future leaders must not only understand technology but also develop the ability to harness it for sustainable growth. Students listened attentively and asked thoughtful questions about AI applications in business functions. The session left students inspired to upskill in analytics and digital literacy.
