Objectives of the Programme

The objectives of the CPD programme were to:

The session focused on **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** related to maternal and child health, key indicators, and the role of nurses in achieving national and global health targets through evidence-based practice and digital monitoring systems.

Session II: Antenatal Surveillance

The second session was conducted by **Dr. N. Sujita Devi**, Associate Professor, BV(DU) College of Nursing, Pune. She explained **antenatal surveillance**, early identification of high-risk pregnancies, use of digital tools for monitoring maternal and fetal well-being, and the importance of timely interventions to reduce maternal and perinatal morbidity and mortality.

Session III: Midwifery and Digital Technology

Session IV: Care of High-Risk New-born

The speaker discussed **care of high-risk new-borns**, including thermal regulation, infection prevention, feeding practices, respiratory support, and the use of digital monitoring devices in neonatal care.

Session V: Artificial Intelligence in New-born Care

The final scientific session was conducted by **Mrs. Manisha Gadade**, Assistant Professor, BV(DU) College of Nursing, Pune. The session highlighted the application of **Artificial**

Intelligence (AI) in new-born care, such as early detection of neonatal complications, smart monitoring systems, and future trends in neonatal nursing practice.

Valedictory Session and Conclusion

The programme concluded with a post-test and valedictory session. Participants expressed positive feedback and reported enhanced knowledge and confidence in applying digital technology in maternal and new-born care.


