**Report on – Educational Tour Report**

**Venue – Bangalore, Mysore & Ooty**

**Date – 8<sup>th</sup> April 2026 to 12<sup>th</sup> April 2026**

**No. of Teachers Participated – 7**

### DETAILS OF THE ACTIVITY

Bharati Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University), College of Nursing, Sangli, organized a 5-day educational tour for Final Year UG and PG students from **08th April 2026 to 12th April 2026**. The tour covered Bangalore, Mysore, and Ooty, aiming to enhance students' academic exposure and provide practical insights into healthcare institutions.

A total of **138 students**, **7 faculty members**, and **1 non-teaching staff** participated. The entire tour was organized by **NMT India Holidays**. Students were divided into **7 groups**, each consisting of:

- 1 M.Sc Nursing student
- 4 P.B.B.Sc Nursing students
- 15 B.Sc Nursing students

Each group was assigned a faculty coordinator, and responsibilities were distributed accordingly.

### Day 1: 08/04/2026 (Journey Begins)

The students, faculty members, and the NMT team assembled at Miraj Junction well ahead of departure, ensuring all travel arrangements were in place. The I/C Principal Dr. Suresh Kumar Ray, along with the coordinators of the batches going for the educational visit, Dr. Vijaya Kumbhar and Ms. Akkamahadevi Bergeri, had come to the railway station to meet the students and faculty before they left for the journey. The Faculty members who accompanied the students for the visit were, Dr. Bahubali Geddugol, Mrs. Shilpa Satarkar, Mrs. Nikita Bhandari, Mrs. Tejaswini Chougule, Mr. Sachin Sakate, Mr. Nikhil Jadhav, Mrs. Milka Devraj & Mr. Siddharth Khade (Non-teaching staff). At precisely 3:30 PM, the group boarded the train bound for Bangalore, marking the official commencement of the journey. The atmosphere was filled with enthusiasm and anticipation, as participants looked forward to the experiences and learning opportunities that lay ahead. Lively conversations, cheerful interactions, and a shared sense of purpose created a positive and energetic environment right from the start. As the train departed, the group settled into their seats, carrying with them a spirit of excitement and curiosity that set the tone for the rest of the trip.



## Day 2: 09/04/2026 (Mysore Visit & Educational Exposure)

Upon arrival at Yeshwantpur Railway Station, Bangalore, an untoward incident was narrowly averted due to the prompt and responsible actions of the students. As two elderly passengers were in the process of alighting from the train, it began to move, causing them to lose balance and fall. Recognizing the imminent danger, the students of Bharati Vidyapeeth Nursing College, Sangli, immediately rushed to their aid. Their swift intervention ensured the safety of the elderly individuals and successfully prevented what could have resulted in serious injury or a fatal accident. The presence of mind, alertness, and compassionate response demonstrated by the students were highly commendable and reflected their training and sense of social responsibility.

The group reached **Bangalore at 5:45 AM**, from where luxury buses arranged by NMT transported everyone to Mysore.

- **Arrival at Hotel President (9:30 AM)**

Accommodation was arranged, followed by a delicious breakfast.

- **Educational Visit to JSS College & Hospital, Mysore**

- **JSS College (12:30 PM – 2:00 PM)**

The group visited JSS College of Nursing, where they were warmly received by faculty members. Dr. Purohit Sarawati, Head of the Department of Mental Health Nursing, conducted an informative session for the students. She provided comprehensive insights into the academic structure of the institution, including curriculum planning, teaching methodologies, and evaluation systems. She also elaborated on the various student support facilities available on campus, such as well-equipped laboratories, library resources, clinical training opportunities, and extracurricular development programs. The session helped students gain a clear understanding of how academic excellence and practical exposure are integrated at the institution.

- **JSS Hospital (2:15 PM – 3:45 PM)**

Following the college visit, the group proceeded to JSS Hospital for a detailed institutional tour. Mrs. Janet Mathias addressed the participants and explained the organizational structure and leadership framework of the hospital. She highlighted the roles and responsibilities within the nursing administration and emphasized the importance of effective coordination in delivering quality patient care. The hospital, an 1800-bedded multispecialty institution, is equipped with advanced medical technologies and offers a wide range of specialized healthcare services. The visit provided students with valuable exposure to real-world hospital management practices and the functioning of a large-scale healthcare facility.



### Day 3: 10/04/2026 (Ooty Sightseeing)

- Departure from Mysore at **6:00 AM** towards Ooty.
- En route, students observed wildlife during the forest journey.

#### **Places Visited:**

- **Doddabetta Peak** – Highest peak in the Nilgiri Mountains with scenic views.
- **Tea Factory & Chocolate Factory** – Demonstration of tea and chocolate production.
- **Government Botanical Garden** – Known for diverse plant species, glasshouse, and Italian-style garden.
- **Local Market** – Students enjoyed shopping.
- **Tea Gardens** – Opportunity for photography and enjoying natural beauty.

The group returned to Mysore at **11:00 PM**, feeling satisfied and delighted.



## Day 4: 11/04/2026 (Bangalore Educational Visits)

### **Visits Conducted:**

#### **1. Ramaiah Institute of Nursing Education and Research (11:00 AM – 2:30 PM)**

The group visited Ramaiah Institute of Nursing Education and Research, a renowned institution known for its contribution to nursing education and research. Established in 1987 by Dr. M. S. Ramaiah, the institute has grown into a center of academic excellence, focusing on both theoretical knowledge and clinical competence.

During the visit, Mr. Yogendra Prabhu, Associate Professor, conducted an informative session for the students and faculty. He provided detailed insights into the institution's academic framework, including its curriculum structure, teaching methodologies, research initiatives, and student development programs. 2. **Lunch** – Provided by NMT team. Post lunch

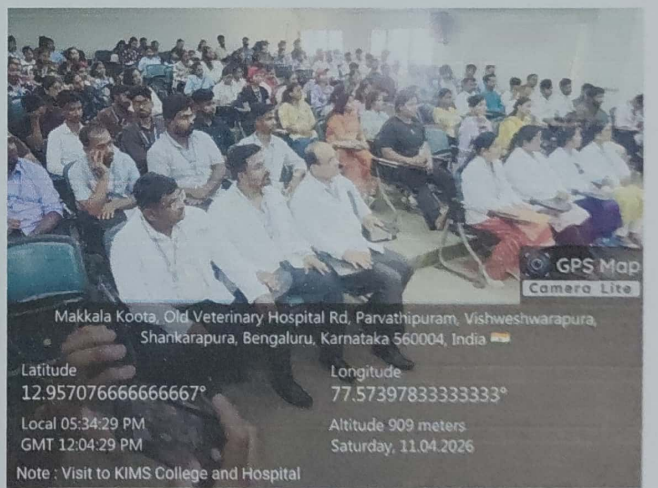
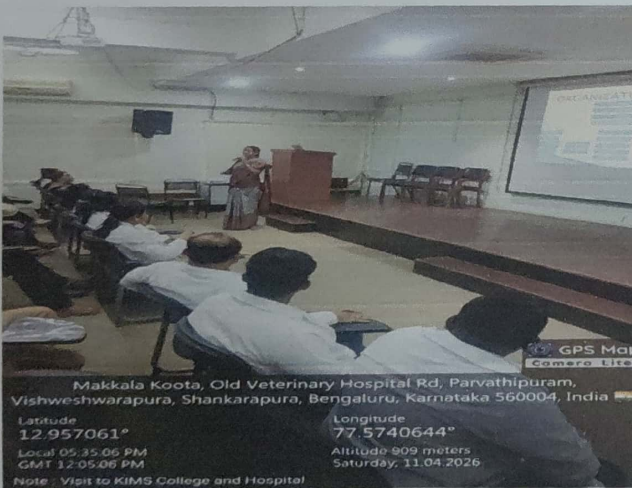
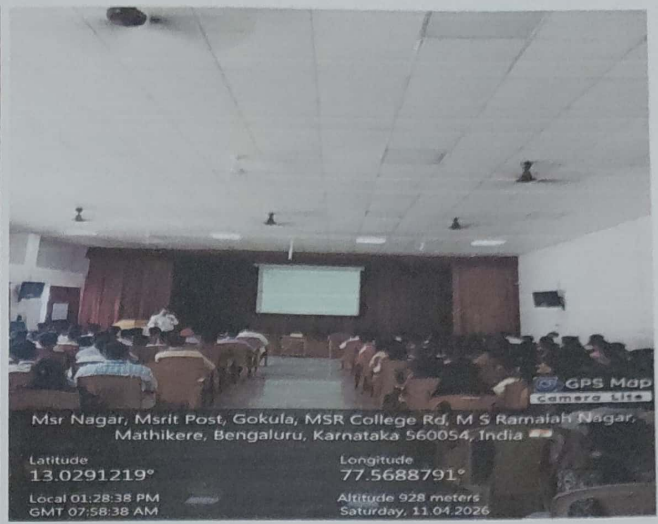
#### **3. Kempegowda Institute of Nursing Sciences (4:30 PM)**
